Taking the Pulse of Food Legislation in Maine

Augusta, Maine (January 28, 2015) – The Maine Food Strategy (MFS) today released a comprehensive, nonpartisan overview of agriculture, fishing and food legislation from the past session to serve as a guide as the 127th Maine State Legislature gets underway.

Pulse Check: Food Policy Report of the 126th Legislature describes the outcome of 54 bills ranging from GMO labeling to Maine fisheries management to poultry processing. This recap reinforces the importance of food issues relative to setting policy in the State of Maine and highlights issues that may arise in the 127th Legislature.

Written in laymen's terms, Pulse Check is posted under the Maine Food Strategy Reports page at www.mainefoodstrategy.org and is available for anyone interested in local food and fish policy legislation.
